



10-MINUTE BIBLE LESSON

Make Disciples

Matthew 28:16-20

Before watching the video: What do you already know about the post-resurrection stories in the Gospels? Where have you seen them depicted in songs, TV shows, movies, and so on? What do you remember about them?

Now read the passage twice. Take time to notice every sentence and phrase. What stands out to you?

¹⁰I rejoice in the Lord greatly that now at last you have revived your concern for me; indeed, you were concerned for me, but had no opportunity to show it. ¹¹Not that I am ¹⁶Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. ¹⁷When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. ¹⁸And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." – **Matthew 28:16-20**

After watching the video: Early in the passage, most of the disciples who see Jesus rejoice and worship. However, it says, some still doubted. What do you think the relationship is between faith and doubt? Do you think it's possible to believe while working through questions?

What comes to mind when you hear the word "disciple?" What sorts of things do you think being one involves?

Jesus commissions his followers to make disciples, which according to him includes baptizing and teaching them. It suggests that being a disciple takes more than learning information. It also involves applying what you're taught to decisions and actions. In what ways do you think this may be needed in your life?

Conclude in prayer. Thank God for blessings, ask forgiveness for wrongs done, request help for uncertainty. Close with "amen."
